Conscious Communication, Consistent Care

As a former teacher, Tracey has had the joy of working in the beautiful mosaics formed through diverse, inner city school communities. As a result, she is often called upon to help staff teams better understand how to engage and build quality relationships with students and their families.

This keynote makes the case clear that any attempt to improve these relationships must begin with a commitment to conscious communication and consistent care; where families feel celebrated and not just tolerated. Staff teams are encouraged to reflect on how their feelings affect their dealings with families and how 'relational credit in the bank' can be gained and used to best effect.

This keynote challenges the perspectives of practitioners who can often see problems, rather than seeing people who need support and patience.

This keynote has helped school teams to:

- **Evaluate** their heart posture towards the students and families in their school community.
- Consider the impact of their words and their ways.
- **Increase** their capacity to support students to push beyond perceived boundaries.

The post-Covid classroom calls for a different approach to the leadership and management of behaviour.

With rising levels of mental health problems among children and young people, leaders need to be able to cultivate the kind of culture where students feel safe, and staff feel supported.

This keynote seeks to help leaders understand how to make lasting impact on behaviour culture, through the building of robust systems and provision of high quality support.

Some Things Never Change

Tracey is a dynamic speaker and trainer who speaks candidly about her own challenging behaviour, which led to multiple fixed-term exclusions from both primary and secondary school. She believes that it was the constant caring presence of one teacher that transformed her school experience; helping her to see that challenging behaviour need not define her present or dictate her future.

As a primary school teacher, Tracey soon became known for her joy-filled style of teaching, leading to one school leader comparing her literacy lesson to a trip to the theatre!

Tracey's ability to positively engage children with behaviour difficulties was quickly detected leading to her becoming one of the UK's first Advanced Skills Teachers in Behaviour Management.

In 2012, Tracey became the CEO and Founder of **Together Transforming Behaviour**, a company providing training and coaching to teachers and parents, helping them to understand and respond to children's behaviour.

She recently founded **The Academy for Behaviour Leadership**; a one-year course designed to train behaviour leaders to transform behaviour culture.

Tracey is a captivating trainer with a clear message to adults working with children in school: will you be the one to choose to cherish children in their challenging moments?

Her keynote speeches are consistently described as 'outstanding' and 'inspirational' and conclude with a call for listeners to move beyond inspiration to application of the keynote principles.

Tracey is the author of two books, 'Will You be the One? Touching the hearts of teachers, changing the lives of children with challenging behaviour,' published in 2012.

Her second title 'Behaviour Basics for Parents; Giving You the Tools from Schools' was published in 2017.

Tracey featured in the 2014 Channel 4 documentary 'Mr Drew's School for Boys' and later appeared on ITV's This Morning and BBC Radio 5 Live.


